5 Tips to Get Lent Back on Track

1. Run, don't walk to Confession. The whole goal of Lent is to grow in grace and this is the surest, swiftest means to "begin again."

- 2. Examine your Lenten resolution. What is it? Why is it? When and where do you break down in keeping it? Figure out your "triggers" for temptation.
- 3. Ask for help. Ask the saints, and perhaps ask your family or friends. Tell them of your Lenten fast, and ask them to help you, particularly if you have points in the day when fasting becomes difficult.
- 4. Pair your fast with a petition for someone and write it down. Write it down daily. Today, I am fasting from X for this person ... because of whatever it is. It will help you to remember what you are doing and why you are doing it.
- 5. Reflect at the end of the day. Talk to God about your fast, ask Him to show you how you can better love Him, better see Him, better hear him.

Keep at it. Fasting is not easy. Forty days is not short. Old habits and sins are hard to root out and pull out of how we respond to ourselves, God, and the world.

It will take prayer and time and persistence. Take comfort in the reality that God wants this for us, the saints are rooting for us, and every moment is another opportunity to "begin again." Have a blessed Lent.

Cardinal Tagle Speaks on Families

Cardinal Luis Antonio Tagle, the Archbishop of Manila, will give a public address at the Queen Elizabeth Theatre (630 Hamilton St., Vancouver) on Monday, March 19, beginning at 6:00 p.m. He will also celebrate Mass at Holy Rosary

Cathedral at 12:30 p.m. (in place of the usual 12:10 Mass) the same day. Cardinal Tagle is known for his passionate speeches, and is a much-loved and highly sought-after international speaker.

Highlighting one of our archdiocesan priorities and goals: "Strengthening Marriages and Families", Cardinal Tagle will address the challenges of living the faith within family life. Family time, among today's many distractions, continues to be an almost lost reality for many. Join us for his talk on "Keeping Families in Faith: The Domestic Church in a Global Village".

Ordained as bishop in 2001, Cardinal Tagle became archbishop ten years later, and was elevated to the College of Cardinals a year later in 2012. He was the seventh Filipino to be made a Cardinal and the second youngest Cardinal at the time. He holds a licentiate and doctorate in Sacred Theology from the Catholic University of America, Washington, DC, and was recently named by Pope Francis as one of the Synod Fathers for the Synod of Bishops on the New Evangelization.

6:00 p.m. in the Mallon Room, with Stations of the Cross following at 7 p.m. All are welcome.

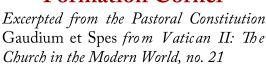
Men's North Shore Retreat
